



Would like (modal auxiliary)

We use **would like** to say politely what we want, to make invitations and offers, and to ask about preferences in general.

Check the following charts, notice the difference between using the auxiliary followed by a noun and followed by a verb.

	Subject	Auxiliary verb	Main verb	Noun
+	She	would	like	coffee.

-	He	would not	like	whisky.

When we want to invite someone to do something we add **TO + VERB**

	Subject	Auxiliary verb	Main verb	TO	Verb
+	She	would	like	to	go.
		'd			
-	He	would not	like	to	stay home.
		wouldn't			
?	Would	you	like	to	dance?
