



### MODIFIERS WITH PARTICIPLES AND PREPOSITIONS

- Useful to give extra information and join two different sentences into one.
- We can use participles (gerunds) or prepositions.

Who's Jack? Which one is Jack?	He's <b>the man</b> He's <b>the one</b>	<b>PARTICIPLES</b> <b>wearing</b> a black sweater. <b>talking</b> to Lisa.
Who's Lisa?	She's <b>the woman</b>	<b>PREPOSITIONS</b> <b>with</b> long red hair.
Which one is Dorothy?	She's <b>the short one</b>	<b>in</b> jeans.
Who are the Johnsons?	They're <b>the people</b>	<b>next to</b> the door.
Which ones are the Johnsons?	They're <b>the ones</b>	<b>on</b> the couch.
