



## It clauses and adverbial clauses with When

To talk about feelings provoked by certain actions, we can use either of the following structures:

Subject	Verb (feeling)	Object	when	situation
I	love	it	when	my mom cooks pasta.
I	hate	it	when	people eat with their mouth opened.
The teacher	doesn't like	it	when	students speak Spanish.
We	can't stand	it	when	people cut into the line.
My dog	likes	it	when	I pet him.

It	Verb (feeling)	Object (the person who feels it)	when	situation
It	bothers	me	when	people are distracted with their cell phones.
It	upsets	my sister	when	I wear her clothes.
It	annoys	me	when	people call me late at night.
It	makes	me <i>happy</i> *	when	I get good grades.
		*Exception: with make, add the adjective after the object
