A noun clause is a part of a sentence with a subject and a predicative that functions as a noun.

Trouble Problem	with	<p>1. I am the best in my class. 2. The problem is that I get high expectations.</p> <p>=</p> <p><i>"The problem with being the best in my class is that I get high expectations".</i></p> <p>or</p> <p><i>The trouble with being the best in my class is that I get high expectations".</i></p>
Advantage Disadvantage Benefit Downside	of	<p>1. I am the best in my class. 2. The disadvantage is that I get high expectations.</p> <p>=</p> <p><i>"The disadvantage of being the best in my class is that I get high expectations".</i></p>
Thing Part	about	<p>1. I am the best in my class. 2. The nice thing is that I get good grades.</p> <p>=</p> <p><i>"The nice thing about being the best in my class is that I get good grades".</i></p>
