Infinitive and Gerund Phrases To comment on behavior, we can use the following structures:	
It + be + adjective/noun + infinitive phrase	These sentences can also be restated with gerund phrases.
It's rude to ignore your conversation partner.	Ignoring your conversation partner is rude.
It's a good idea to try out different topics	Trying out differents topics is a good idea.
The word <i>considered</i> may also follow be in this kind of sentence.	
It's considered impolite to interrupt people.	Interrupting people is considered impolite.
These sentences can also include the phrase <i>for</i> + person/pronoun.	
It's customary for the complimenter to say nice things about others	Saying nice things about others is customary for the complimenter.
